Probably only Micromelum attracts more butterflies than this species. Not only butterflies but many other insects as well.



The Cruiser

A very fast flying butterfly. The larvae feed on vines in the Passifloraceae family, such as Adenia and Passiflora.



Common Eggfly female

The larvae of this very widespread butterfly feed on herbs such as Alternanthera, seedlings of Ipomea and the weed Sida rhombifolia..



Australian Rustic

The larvae of this species feed on plants in the Flacourtiaceae family such as Flacourtia, Scolopia and Xylosma.



Cornelian

This beautiful little butterfly is bright orange on the top. Instead of eating leaves the larvae of this species feed on seeds of plants in the Sapindaceae family, especially Harpullia.



Helenita Blue

Resting between feeds this little beauty is brighter than a Ulysses. Host plants include Brachychiton acerifolius.



Zodiac Moth

The spectacular Zodiac Moth is a common sight on the Tablelands. Its host plant is Omphalea species.
