It was probably a combination of the shake-up from Larry and the sudden increase in light levels that has shocked many species into flowering, some for the first time. Following are some images of the various species.



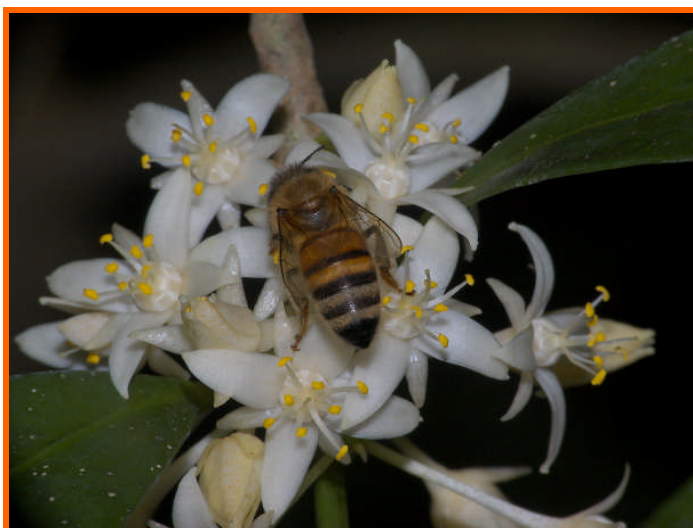
Xanthostemon xerophilus

From Cape York Peninsula. It grows in sand and sandstone north and south of the Jardine River.



Dissiliaria sp. Little Cooper Creek

From Little Cooper Creek. Spectacular new growth. Inserts show male (right) and female (left) flowers.



Medicosma fareana

An understory shrub more common north of the Daintree River. Has not flowered since 1988.



Rhodamnia sessiliflora

Common in the wet tropics in both lowland and upland rainforest. Previously in too much shade to flower.



Dissiliaria tuckeri

Flowered for the first time. Female plant only flowered.



Melodinus australis

A large vine. Flowering for the second time this year.
